This rule is being filed according to a R.C. 119.032 review. This rule is also proposed to replace existing rule 4765-11-07 due to fifty percent guideline. It is estimated that changes to the new rule strike approximately fifty percent of the text in the existing rule while adding a comparable amount of new text.

This rule sets forth the reinstatement requirements for a fire charter that has expired. Changes to this new rule clarify the timeline and requirements for reinstating an expired charter. Timelines were changed to be consistent with the reinstatement timeline for EMS schools. Since many training institutions are also accredited by the State Board of EMS, this will afford consistency in the processes for reinstatement both fire and EMS training institutions. Additionally, language was added to this rule to identify that the dates and availability of materials incorporated by reference are located in paragraph (CC) of rule 4765-11-01(N).

A.) Does this rule require a license, permit, or any other prior authorization to engage in or operate a line of business? No

This rule, in and of itself, does not require prior authorization to engage in business. However, it is part of a filing package that does, as some provisions in Chapter 4765-11 require fire service training programs to receive and renew approval from the EMS executive director for a program charter prior to offering courses at the following classification levels: volunteer firefighter, firefighter I, firefighter II, fire safety inspector, fire instructor or fire safety instructor.

B.) Does this rule impose a criminal penalty, a civil penalty, or another sanction, or create a cause of action, for failure to comply with its terms? Yes

This rule provides that failure to comply with the terms set forth in this rule may result in an application for reinstatement of an expired fire charter to be denied, while other provisions in Chapter 4765-11 establish that an administrative sanction up to and including revocation of a fire service training program charter or classification may be imposed for violations of Chapter 4765-11 of the Administrative Code pursuant to rule 4765-23-02 of the Administrative Code.

C.) Does this rule require specific expenditures or the report of information as a condition of compliance? No

This rule, in and of itself, does not require specific expenditures or the report of information. However, it is part of a filing package that does, as provisions in Chapter 4765-11 require fire chartered programs to comply with curriculum objectives and instructional hours set forth in this chapter, which would include the cost of instructional materials, instructor time, and equipment as the program deems necessary. Additionally, provisions of Chapter 4765-11 require chartered programs to submit written notice of change in a program's business information within 10 days of the date the change occurred.
