As such, there is no additional cost of compliance. EMT-basics must still pay the cost of obtaining their continuing education requirements. The cost for meeting the continuing education requirements is approximately two hundred dollars (\$200), and will vary by location. There is no cost to county or municipal governments unless they choose to pay the cost for the individual EMT-basic; this cost may then be offset by grant money from the Division of EMS.
