This rule is being filed according to a R.C. 119.032 review. This rule is also proposed to replace existing rule 4765-20-01 due to LSC's fifty percent guideline. It is estimated that changes to the new rule strike approximately fifty percent of the text in the existing rule while adding a comparable amount of new text.

This rule prohibits a person from providing firefighting, fire safety inspector, and fire instructor services without possessing the appropriate certificate issued by the EMS Executive Director. The proposed change in this new rule deletes paragraph (B) in its entirety as the twelve-month deadline to which it refers expired in January 2009.

This rule sets forth the requirement that no person shall provide firefighting, fire safety inspector, fire instruction, or other related services without possessing the appropriate certificate issued by the EMS executive director pursuant to section 4765.55 of the Revised Code and Chapter 4765-11 of the Administrative Code.

This rule sets forth the requirement that no person shall provide firefighting, fire safety inspector, fire instruction, or other related services without possessing the appropriate certificate. In and of itself, this rule does not impose a criminal penalty or other sanction for failure to comply with its terms; however, in accordance with section 3737.99 of the Revised Code, a person who acts as a firefighter, volunteer firefighter, or member of a fire department without first having received a certificate issued in accordance with section 4765.55 of the Revised Code is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree.
