This rule is being filed according to a R.C. 119.032 review. This rule is also proposed to replace existing rule 4765-20-04 due to LSC's fifty percent guideline. It is estimated that changes to the new rule strike approximately fifty percent of the text in the existing rule while adding a comparable amount of new text.

This rule sets forth the application process for firefighter, fire safety inspector, and instructor. Changes to this new rule clarify an application that is not completely filled out may be deemed incomplete and not be processed by the Division. Furthermore, it requires the Division to notify the applicant of the deficiencies in the application.
