This rule is being filed pursuant to a completed R.C. 119.032 five-year rule review. This rule is being proposed for rescission due to LSC's fifty percent guideline. It is estimated that changes to the rule strike approximately half of the existing text while adding a comparable amount of new text. This rule is simultaneously being proposed as a new rule under the same rule number.

This rule sets forth the guidelines for the firefighter, fire safety inspector, and instructor examinations.

A.) Does this rule require a license, permit, or any other prior authorization to engage in or operate a line of business? **No**

This rule is being rescinded and simultaneously proposed for adoption under this same rule number. In and of itself, it does not require prior authorization to engage in business. However, it is part of a filing package that does, as some provisions in Chapter 4765-20 require firefighters and fire safety inspectors to apply for the appropriate certificate issued by the EMS executive director prior to engaging in fire services.

B.) Does this rule impose a criminal penalty, a civil penalty, or another sanction, or create a cause of action, for failure to comply with its terms? **No**

This rule is being rescinded and simultaneously proposed for adoption under this same rule number. In and of itself, it does not impose a penalty or sanction. However, it is part of a filing package that does, as administrative sanction up to and including revocation of a firefighter or fire safety inspector certificate may be imposed for certain violations of Chapter 4765-20 of the Administrative Code pursuant to rule 4765-23-02 of the Administrative Code.

C.) Does this rule require specific expenditures or the report of information as a condition of compliance? **Yes**

This rule is being rescinded and simultaneously proposed for adoption under this same rule number. However, as this rule set forth examination requirements, it is estimated that stakeholders may have incurred \$35 - \$75 per examination if an examination fee was charged. The costs are set by the authorized testing center. The cost to administer a written examination will be less than the cost to administer a practical examination. Examination costs will also vary by firefighter classification level.
