Reinstatement of a certificate of fire training.**RULE SUMMARY**

6. State the reason(s) for proposing (i.e., why are you filing,) this rule:

This rule is being filed pursuant to a completed R.C. 119.032 five-year rule review. This rule is being proposed for rescission due to LSC's fifty percent guideline. It is estimated that changes to the rule strike approximately half of the existing text while adding a comparable amount of new text. This rule is simultaneously being proposed as a new rule under the same rule number.

This rule sets forth the requirements for reinstatement of a firefighter or fire safety inspector certificate that has expired or has been voluntarily surrendered.

The material incorporated by reference in this rule includes an agency application. While this form is commonly known and has been made generally available to affected persons, this rule did not originally address the material in compliance with sections 121.71 to 121.74 of the Revised Code. This rule is simultaneously proposed for rescission and adoption under this same rule number, in part, to address these materials. The new rule, under this same rule number, will refer readers to rule 4765-11-01(N) (See filing package 114977) where all materials incorporated by reference in Chapter 4765-11 and Chapters 4765-20 to 4765-23 are addressed.

A.) Does this rule require a license, permit, or any other prior authorization to engage in or operate a line of business? **No**

This rule is being rescinded and simultaneously proposed for adoption under this same rule number. In and of itself, it did not require prior authorization to engage in business. However, it is part of a filing package that does, as some provisions in Chapter 4765-20 require firefighters and fire safety inspectors to apply for the appropriate certificate issued by the EMS executive director prior to engaging in fire services.

B.) Does this rule impose a criminal penalty, a civil penalty, or another sanction, or create a cause of action, for failure to comply with its terms? **Yes**

This rule is being rescinded and simultaneously proposed for adoption under this same rule number. However, this rule provided that failure to comply with the terms set forth in this rule may result in an application for reinstatement to be denied.

C.) Does this rule require specific expenditures or the report of information as a condition of compliance? **Yes**

This rule is being rescinded and simultaneously proposed for adoption under this same rule number. However, in accordance with this rule, stakeholders could expect to \$75 to \$2250 for reinstatement, which is dependent upon the time elapsed since the expiration, or voluntary surrender, of the certificate to practice and continuing education or examination requirements.

Source: The estimated cost was determined by the Firefighter and Fire Safety Inspector Training Committee and replies to a statewide survey sent to all chartered programs to ascertain adverse impact. The committee members include fire chiefs,

firefighters, fire instructors, fire safety inspector instructors, fire safety inspectors, and training program directors.
