This rule is being proposed in accordance with HB 401 (126th G.A.). This bill requires the Executive Director of the Division of EMS, with advice and counsel of the Firefighter and Fire Safety Inspector Committee, to adopt rules regarding, in general, training and education standards and certification and renewal requirements for firefighters, fire safety inspectors, fire instructors, and fire charters, as well as disciplinary guidelines and procedures for such certificate holders.

This rule establishes the process for applying for reinstatement of a revoked certificate of fire training, including factors the Executive Director can take into consideration when making a determination of whether to reinstate a revoked certificate.

This rule sets forth the process of reinstating a revoked certificate of fire training. For those certificate holders who reinstate their certificates within eighteen months of expiration, there will be no cost of compliance. Those certificate holders who fail to reinstate their certificates within eighteen months must complete a new course of instruction, which varies in cost depending on the level of certification and specific charter. Some certificate holders (i.e., those firefighters who were revoked due to having a criminal conviction) may incur costs associated with submitting a BCI&I criminal background check, as referenced in 4765-20-04 of the Administrative Code. Such firefighters will have to pay approximately \$15 to obtain the background check and will incur minimal copying charges to send a certified copy of the police report and judgment entry to the Division.
