This rule is being filed according to a R.C. 119.032 review. This rule is also proposed to replace existing rule 4765-20-09 due to LSC's fifty percent guideline. It is estimated that changes to the new rule strike approximately fifty percent of the text in the existing rule while adding a comparable amount of new text.

Additionally, language was added to this rule to address the dates and availability of materials incorporated by reference by referring readers to rule 4765-11-01(N)of the OAC (See filing package 114977).
