OAC rule 4765-5-02 requires EMS organizations to report to the EMSIRS to maintain eligibility for the EMS grants. EMS organizations may be deemed ineligible to receive EMS grant awards if they fail to report their designated medical directors' qualifications or changes in qualifications to the EMFTS Board.
