Rule 4766-4-04 sets forth the criteria used to inspect physical facilities designated by medical transportation organization as service headquarters and service satellite bases and vehicles. Criteria include the licenses that must be posted, the need for a required sanitation plan and adherence to a standard of cleanliness and state and local building and fire codes. The rule also sets forth what may be inspected and when

inspections may occur and references the location of the "MoICU Inspection" form, which identifies the single use supplies and equipment which must be maintained at each physical facility. Amendments include revising "a" to "an" in two paragraphs.
