The rule is amended to correct an error made when the rule was filed in 2017.

OAC 4766-4-09 sets forth the documentaîon that licensed medical transportation organizations (MTOs) are required to maintain related to the inspection conducted at least annually on each of their MolCUs and non-transport vehicles, which includes: date and description of service/repairs performed; "out of service" signs on permitted vehicles that have been removed from service; and documentation about the

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biomedical equipment carried by vehicles. Revisions of rule 4765-4-09 filed in May of 2017 were intended to set forth a schedule for periodic mechanical safety inspections at every 25,000 miles for each permitted vehicle with an odometer reading of 150,000 miles or more. The 2017 filing includes 20,000 miles instead of 25,000 miles, and that is corrected with this proposed amendment.
