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language in paragraph (A)(1) was removed and replaced with "Section 5107.05 of the Revised Code authorizes the director of job and family services to adopt rules as necessary to comply with Title IV-A, Title IV-D, federal regulations, state law, and the state plan"; paragraph (A)(3) was stricken as language under paragraph (A)(2) references that the county agencies will follow requirements contained in this rule and not in accordance with section 5107.36 of the Revised Code; and minor language changes were made to improve clarity.
