work participation rates?"; Paragraph (A)(1) was removed and replaced with "Section 5107.05 of the Revised Code authorizes the director of job and family services to adopt rules as necessary to comply with Title IV-A, Title IV-D, federal regulations, state law, and the state plan"; Paragraph (A)(2) was removed and replaced with "The county agency shall administer the work activity programs in accordance with the requirements contained in this rule and not in accordance with sections 5107.40, 5107.42 and 5107.44 of the Revised Code"; The effective dates of references to 45 C.F.R. in paragraph (B) were updated; Countable core and non-core federal work activities were moved to paragraph (F) and titled "What are countable federal work activities?"; Paragraph (G) was updated to include the federal work participation requirements. Language regarding federal work activities was moved to paragraph (F) for clarity; The paragraph regarding the single custodial parent disregard was moved to (G)(6) and language was added to improve clarity; Paragraph (H) was added and describes when federal work participation hours are deemed to have been met; Minor language changes were also made to improve clarity.
