

## 5101:1-39-28 Household goods and personal effects as resources.

- (A) "Household goods" are all personal property customarily found in the home and used in connection with the maintenance, use and occupancy of the premises. <u>This</u> <u>encompasses items necessary for an adequate standard of sustenance,</u> <u>accommodation, comfort, information and entertainment of occupants and guests.</u> <u>Examples include furniture, furnishings, linens, household appliances, carpets,</u> <u>dishes, cooking and eating utensils, television sets and tools. TheyThese items</u> are assumed to be of a reasonable value and are exempt as a resource.
- (B) "Personal effects" are other personal property normally held and recognized as incidental items intended for personal use by one or more household members. <u>Examples are clothing, jewelry, watches, personal grooming articles and musical instruments. TheyThese items</u> are assumed to be of a reasonable value and are exempt as a resource.
