To implement provisions of O.R.C. section 5111.18, adopted under Am. Sub. H.B. 530, 126th G.A., which instructs the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services to establish a qualified state long-term care insurance partnership (QLTCP) program consistent with the definition in 42 U.S.C. 1396p(b)(1)(C)(iii). This rule is being amended to clarify that the qualified long-term care partnership program enacted under that statute does not affect the home equity limit.

7. If the rule is an AMENDMENT, then summarize the changes and the content of the proposed rule; If the rule type is RESCISSION, NEW or NO CHANGE, then summarize the content of the rule:

The rule describes the treatment of an individual's home for purposes of determining eligibility for medical assistance. A definition of "qualified long term care partnership (QLTCP)" has been added, as well as a paragraph stating that a disregard resulting from participation in the QLTCP does not affect the home equity limit. A definition of "home equity limit" has also been added for clarification; throughout the rule, the current dollar value of the limit (five hundred thousand dollars) has been replaced with the term "home equity limit".
