5101:2-1-01 contains definitions used throughout 5101:2. Proposed changes to the rule include adding a definition of a "Family Preservation Center" (definition #127) and "Residential Infant Care Center" (definition #273). Additionally, a definition was added for a "Qualified Residential Treatment Program" (definition #257) and "Professional Treatment Staff" (definition #246) as well as clarifications of current term language were made.

licensing requirements of Chapter 4757. of the Revised Code shall meet the requirements of sections 5153.112 and 5153.122 of the Revised Code.
