This rule requires that public children services agencies (PCSAs) have a county

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child abuse and neglect memorandum of understanding pursuant to section 2151.421 of the Revised Code. The memorandum sets forth the normal operating procedures to be employed by concerned officials in the assessment/investigation of child abuse and/or neglect reports. It is substantially the same as rule 5101:2-34-71, which it is replacing. Changes include the addition of new parties, the county humane society and certain children's advocacy center members, as signers to the memorandum of understanding. There is also a new requirement that the PCSAs submit copies of the memorandums to the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services.
