This rule contains the PCSA requirements for conducting safety assessments in all child abuse, neglect, and dependency reports. A clarification has been made that the completion of a safety assessment does not apply to children in the permanent custody of a PCSA. Obsolete form numbers were removed. Time frames to

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complete the safety assessment have remained unchanged but the time to have them approved by a supervisor and recorded in SACWIS has been developed. Grammatical changes, restructuring the order of paragraphs, and amendments to requirements for consistent understanding have occurred throughout the rule.
