This new rule is being proposed to replace existing rule 5101:2-42-89, which is being rescinded as a result of the five year rule review.

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This rule governs the provision of services required upon the death of a child in either the custody of the Public Children Services Agency (PCSA) or the Private Child Placing Agency (PCSA). Changes from the rescided rule to the new rule include: outlining the procedures to be taken when the death of a child in temporary, planned permanent living arrangements or permanent custody occurs; adds language specifying a time frame of one hour for notifying law enforcement and parent or guardian; sets guideline for the completion of JFS form 01987 "child Fatality Report Face Sheet"; and adds that the reference to rule 5101:2-33-26 shall be followed if the death of a child is the result of suspected child abuse or neglect.
