This rule is being proposed for adoption to replace a rule of the same number and implement the provisions of HB 95 of the 125th General Assembly related to state adoption special service subsidies.

This rule sets forth the eligibility requirements which must be met in order to be approved for a state adoption maintenance subsidy. This rule is different from the rule that it is replacing in that the special service subsidy component of the program is eliminated as required by HB 95. This new rule now incorporates the definition of "a child with special needs" contained in 5101:2-1-01 for ease of reference and clarifies the eligibility requirements for adoptees between the ages of 18 and 21 and the Title IV-E verification requirements. This rule also clarifies the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services contribuion that is currently in place for the state adoptin maintenance subsidy.

After the effective date of this rule, new children will not be enrolled in the state special service subsidy program because that component of the program has been eliminated by HB 95. Children currently eligible for these services will only be eligible if the PCSA continues the program at county option.
