This rule sets forth the requirements for medical coverage under Title XIX for IV-E eligible children from Ohio that are placed in another state. The rule also sets forth the requirements for medical coverage under Title XIX for Title IV-E children that are placed into Ohio from another state. No IV-E eligible child should be denied medical coverage if the other state does not make Medicaid available. Language included in the rule is the requirement to explore other Title XIX medical coverage if a child is redetermined ineligible during the required redetermination period.

Paragraphs (A) and (B) in the rescinded rule have been combined in the new rule. The information within the paragraphs has not changed. The reference to Public Children Services Agency (PCSA) has been changed to Title IV-E agency. The statewide automated child welfare information system (SACWIS) has been used in place of Family and Children Services information system (FACSIS).
