The rule was amended to update terminology and to provide the correct location for the appendix of disqualifying crimes, and to provide alignment with foster care requirements.

7. Summarize the rule's content, and if this is an amended rule, also summarize the rule's changes.

OAC 5101:2-48-09 entitled Application Process and Preservice Training provides guidance to agencies regarding the process and training required for persons seeking

adoption approval. Paragraph (D) was amended to change terminology from adoptive parent to applicant. Paragraph (F)(3) was amended to provide reference to the offense list in appendix A of rule 5101:2-7-02, and to update language to enhance clarity. Paragraphs (O)(9) and (O)(10) were topics of training that need removed. Paragraphs (O)(11) and (O)(12) were amended to remove the requirement of training for a specified time frame for cultural issues and for section 2152.72 of the Revised Code. Paragraph (P) was amended to remove the requirement to not allow the training on cultural issues to be waived, which will allow for cultural training to be a regular topic that could be subject to a waiver. In Paragraph (Q) language was updated to change terminology from handicap to disability, and sexual identity to gender identity.
