This rule is being proposed for amendment to implement section 3107.033 of Sub. HB 7 of the 127th General Assembly and as a result of the five year review process.

This rule outlines the adoption process for a child who had resided with a caregiver for at least twelve consecutive months. The title of the rule has been changed. The time frame a child has to reside with a caregiver has been changed from "twelve consecutive months" to "six consecutive months." The revision dates of the forms have been updated, language requiring notification of initiation of an adoptive homestudy has been removed, and the list of documents which must be reviewed for a foster caregiver to become approved as an adoptive parent has been revised. Finally, the requirement for five year proof of residency in Ohio has been removed and this rule has been amended for clarification.
