5101:2-49-13 **Employment-related case management.**

- (A) A CDHS which certifies acceptance of RRP social service funding must, as a condition of funding, provide employment-related case management to refugees defined as eligible in paragraph (C) of this rule.
- (B) "Case management services" means the determination of which services to refer a refugee to, referral to such services, and tracking of the refugee's participation in such services.
- (C) "Employment-related case management" means case management activities relating to employability services as defined in rule 5101:2-49-08 of the Administrative Code, provided on behalf of refugees whose public assistance payments qualify for ORR reimbursement under the RRP, aid for dependent children, or general assistance programs.
- (D) "Employment-related case management," as conducted by a CDHS, includes the following activities:
- (1) Determining eligibility for services.
 - (2) Providing hearing notices in accordance with rules 5101:2-30-02 to 5101:2-30-028 of the Administrative Code.
 - (3) Assisting service providers in the development of individual employability and service plans and exercising final approval of the employability and service plan submitted by the provider.
 - (4) Making client referrals to service, educational and employment resources.
 - (5) Monitoring service delivery and tracking client progress through the service plan.
 - (6) Receiving, coordinating and transmitting information regarding changes in a client's receipt of public assistance, participation in services, job search and employment placement.
 - (7) Other activities required for the administration of refugee employability services as defined in rule 5101:2-49-08 of the Administrative Code.

- (E) Claims for reimbursement of employment-related case management are not to be charged against a CDHS RRP social service allocation. Expenses for activities meeting the definitions in paragraphs (A) to (D) of this rule may be charged to the state's RRP cash, medical and administrative (CMA) grant.

- (F) Case management activities for nonemployment social services, or otherwise not meeting the definitions of paragraphs (C) and (D) of this rule, must be attributed to the cost of delivering social services and supported by the RRP social service allocation.
