To implement provisions of section 307.90 of Am. Sub. H.B. 110 of the 134th General Assembly, relating to the administration of the multi-system youth program.

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The Ohio Department of Job and Family Services was allocated funds in House Bill 110 to be used for youth currently in the custody of a Public Children Services Agency (PCSA) or to prevent youth from entering into the custody of a PCSA by custody relinquishment for the sole purpose of the child obtaining access to needed treatment. This rule establishes funding transfers and allocations. This rule establishes initiatives to prevent multi system youth from entering custody or to support those already in custody by state level programming, Family and Children First Council shared service and sustainability planning, training and technical assistance, and PCSA relinquishment support.

This rule has been updated with the following changes: (B)(1) was updated with current allocations, (B)(2) has been amended to reflect each State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2022 and 2023 allocations, (B)(3) has been amended to remove evaluation as it was part of the previous biennium allocation, (B)(4) has been amended to reflect current allocations, (B)(5) has been amended to reflect current allocations, (B)(6) has been amended to reflect the current allocation along with the addition of the intention of use of pooled funds to prevent custody relinquishment, and (B)(7) was added to reflect new allocations for environmental scan.
