5101:3-1-60 Medicaid Reimbursement, Appendix DD is being amended to add coverage for three new vaccine codes and to delete a vision code.

The new vaccine codes are being added to be compliant with provisions of 5101:3-4-12 regarding the Vaccines for Children program.

As of 1/1/09, the vision code for antireflective coatings will not be included in the new vision contract and is therefore being removed from coverage effective on that date.

Rule 5101:3-1-60 sets forth the payment provisions for a number of covered services and provider types. Maximum reimbursement amounts for services billed using CPT and HCPCS codes are contained in appendix DD to this rule.

5101:3-1-60 is being amended to include three new vaccines available through the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. The new vaccines and their corresponding CPT codes are: 90681 - Rota (Rotavirus vaccine, live, oral); 90696 - DTaPIPV (diphtheria and tetanus toxoids and acellular pertussis adsorbed and inactivated poliovirus vaccine); and 90698 DTaPIPHI (diphtheria and tetanus toxoids and acellular pertussis adsorbed, inactivated poliovirus and haemophilus b conjugate).

5101:3-1-60 is also being amended to delete vision code V2750, which is for anti-reflective coatings.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

This will decrease revenues.

A decrease in expenditures of approximately \$55,770.00 is expected as a result of this proposed rule amendment. This decrease is attributable solely to the elimination of coverage for the vision code for antireflective coatings.

No change in expenditures is associated with coverage of three new vaccine codes because the vaccines are provided without charge to providers participating in the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. Medicaid reimburses participating VFC providers a fee of \$10.00 for administering these free vaccines to Medicaid eligible children. No net increase in expenditures is contemplated, as the cost of administering the new vaccines is expected to be offset by a corresponding decrease in the cost of administering other similar vaccines.

As the three new vaccines will offset the usage of other existing vaccines, no additional administration fees are contemplated. Consequently, no new cost of compliance is associated with the proposed rule amendment.

There is no new cost of compliance associated with this proposed rule amendment. The three new vaccines which are being added to OAC rule 5101:3-4-12 are part of the Vaccines for Children Program and are available free to participating providers through the Ohio Department of Health. The Ohio Medicaid program reimburses those providers a fee of \$10.00 for administering the vaccine to Medicaid eligible children. This fee amount is indicated in appendix DD to rule 5101:3-1-60. As the three new vaccines will offset the usage of other existing vaccines, no additional administration fees are contemplated. Consequently, no new cost of compliance is associated with the proposed rule amendment.
