This rule is being filed to reflect changes in coding due to new and revised codes for the Healthcare common procedure coding system (HCPCS) for 2006.

This rule is being amended to update local-level and miscellaneous codes. These codes are being updated to comply with the Health Insurance Portability and

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Accountability Act (HIPPA). This rule is also being amended to transition a number of covered items from rent to purchase (R/P) to purchase only (PP). This transition is being done to increase system efficiency to review and process requests for these selected items. This rule also introduces new billing codes for providers to submit for reimbursement of repair services for durable medical equipment (DME).

This rule is being revised to reflect clarifications to HCPCS codes pertaining to maximum allowable units for wound dressings and gauze from a designation of a monthly allotment to each individual dressing. This is being done per provider request for more specific guidelines to utilize when billing the codes pertaining to the medical supplies in question. Code E1001 (Wheel, single) is being removed from the supply list since this item is no longer covered under the Medicaid program since this code is no longer a valid HCPCS code. Codes A7030 (Full face mask for CPAP) and E2371 (Power wheelchair battery, sealed, lead acid battery) are being added to the supply list per provider request. HCPCS codes pertaining to the coverage of a standing frame system (E0637) for children and adults and pediatric gait trainers (E8000, E8001 and E8002) for use by children are being added to the supply list per provider request for consumer access to this equipment in a private residence. Questions 13 and 15 of this RSFA have been modified in order to clarify the agency's projected budgetary and stakeholder impact resulting from this revised filing. Question 4 of this RSFA was changed to correct the statute (from 119.03 to 5111.02).
