This rule is being proposed for adoption in order for the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) to implement the provisions of rule 5101:3-12-02 of the Administrative Code that became effective September 1, 2006 via emergency rule.

This rule sets forth the procedures that must be followed by Medicaid providers and case managers when requesting prior authorization for PDN services for consumers who are not enrolled on a home and community-based services waiver, consumers who are enrolled on an ODMR/DD- or ODA- administered waiver, and consumers who are enrolled on an ODJFS-administered waiver. It also sets forth the procedures to be followed when PDN services are required on an emergency basis.

This rule is being refiled because concurrent with its promulgation, a separate issue arose during the implementation phase of the new PDN service, and payment was delayed to approximately 50 providers. The problem was the result of a computer

error, and steps are being taken to correct it. This computer problem is unrelated to the PDN prior authorization process established in this rule. There is no change to the content of this rule from the previous version.

The procedures set forth in this rule place additional administrative responsibilities on providers of private duty nursing services, as well as case managers serving consumers enrolled in ODMR/DD- and ODA-administered home and community-based services waivers. As a result, this may cause a minor increase in

the administrative expenses of non-agency nurses and home health agencies providing PDN services, as well as county boards of mental retardation and developmental disabilities and PASSPORT administrative agencies which cannot be quantified at this time.
