Chapter 5101:3-13 of the Administrative Code is being re-organized as part of the five year rule review process. This re-organization will coordinate the review cycle for all rules within the Chapter and simplify future reviews. Rule 5101:3-13-01 replaces all, or in part, rules 5101:3-13-01, 5101:3-13-03, 5101:3-13-04, 5101:3-13-05, 3-13-06. This new rule is proposed as part of the five year rule review requirements.

Ambulatory health care clinics (AHCC) are free-standing facilities that furnish outpatient (non-institutional) health care by or under the direction of a physician or dentist, without regard to whether the clinic itself is administered by a physician or dentist. AHCCs are not professional associations of physicians, dentists, optometrists, opticians, podiatrists, or limited practitioners such as physical therapists, psychologists, or chiropractors.

This rule defines the eligibility and enrollment requirements that are applicable to all medicaid providers of ambulatory health care clinc services: primary care clinics, community mental health/alcohol and drug addiction services clinics, public health department clinics, outpatient rehabilitation clinics, family planning, clinics, professional optometry school clinics, professional dental school clinics, speech-language/audiology clinics, diagnostic imaging clinics, and end-stage renal disease dialysis clinics.
