This rule sets forth the assessment rates for the Hospital Care Assurance Program. The amendment updates paragraph (B) to specify to which program year the rule applies. Paragraph (C) establishes an assessment rate of 0.008396619575 of a hospital's adjusted total facility costs up to \$216,372,500 and 0.006 for any amount in excess of \$216,372,500. Throughout this rule, references to the Department of Job and Family Services are replaced with references to the Office of Medical Assistance in accordance with R.C. 5101.01(B)

This is an increase of approximately \$464,688, compared to HCAP 2011, due to a combination of the increase in Ohio's Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP), the Balanced Budget Act of 1997, Medicare Modernization Act of 2002 and the expiration of an allotment increase provided by American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. These funds will be used to make Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) payments to Ohio hospitals totaling \$545.1 million through rule 5101:3-2-09.

Hospitals will be required to pay approximately \$464,688 more than was needed to fund HCAP 2011, due to a combination of the increase in Ohio's Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP), the Balanced Budget Act of 1997, Medicare Modernization Act of 2002 and the expiration of an allotment increase provided by American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

All hospitals, including those owned by counties, townships or municipal corporations, are required to pay an assessment in rule 5101:3-2-08.1, which is used to make disproportionate share payments to Ohio hospitals through rule 5101:3-2-09. Total program assessment revenues for the 2012 program year are approximately \$199,125,714. Of this amount, the Office of Medical Assistance (OMA) estimates that \$8,129,818, a decrease of \$694,177, will be paid by hospitals owned by counties, townships or municipal corporations. This is an increase of approximately \$464,688 for all hospitals, compared to HCAP 2011, due to a combination of the increase in Ohio's Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP), the Balanced Budget Act of 1997, Medicare Modernization Act of 2002 and the expiration of an allotment increase provided by American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. These funds will be used to make Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) payments to Ohio hospitals through rule 5101:3-2-09.

In aggregate, the disproportionate share funding paid to the hospitals exceeds the assessment, although each individual hospital's disproportionate share payment is based on its cost report data as applied in rule 5101:3-2-09.
