To maintain consistency with proposed changes to rule 5101:3-26-01 and to revise provisions for the commencement of coverage.

This rule sets forth provisions and conditions for eligibility, membership, and automatic renewal of membership in managed health care programs. The changes to the rule replace the words "open selection" with the words "open enrollment" and replace the words "selection services entity" with the words "managed care enrollment center." The changes to the rule also remove language regarding requests for exclusion from managed care plan membership made by eligible individuals or MCP members. This language is no longer relevant in this rule, as ODJFS no longer processes continuity of care deferments. Managed care plan members retain the right to initiate termination of membership at any time for just cause, as provided for in paragraph (D)(9) of rule 5101:3-26-02.1 of the Administrative Code.
