This rule sets forth the provisions for the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities to administer Medicaid program services provided by intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded (ICFs-MR). This rule is being adopted since, pursuant to Section 5111.226 of the Revised Code, the Department of Job and Family Services has entered into a contract with the Department of Developmental Disabilities under section 5111.91 of the Revised Code that provides for the Department of Developmental Disabilities to assume the powers and duties of the Department of Job and Family Services with regard to the Medicaid program's coverage of services provided by ICFs-MR.
