This new rule is being proposed to replace an existing rule of the same number and title, which was rescinded as a result of the updates clarifying policies surrounding resident review requirements.

The rule sets forth the resident review requirements which must be met in order to comply with Section 1919 (e)(7) of the Social Security Act which prohibits nursing facilities from retaining individuals with serious mental illness, mental retardation, or developmental disabilities unless a thorough evaluation indicates that such placement is appropriate and adequate services are provided. The new rule was reorganized and simplified to make it easier for a reader to understand the resident review requirements. Additionally, the rule includes a new provision allowing the approval of resident reviews for pre-determined periods of time allowing for greater flexibility to meet the needs of residents with mental illness and/or mental retardation/developmental disabilities.
