This rule is being amended because of the five year rule review and to include the Current Procedural Technology (CPT) code 90663 (Influenza virus vaccine, pandemic formulation) so that providers may bill for immunizations against the pandemic influenza virus, H1N1.

This rule specifies immunizations that are covered for the Medicaid population. The rule is being proposed for amendment to include the Current Procedural Technology (CPT) code 90663 (Influenza virus vaccine, pandemic formulation) to the list of designated free vaccines so that providers may bill for immunizations against the pandemic influenza virus, H1N1. The Department will reimburse \$10 for the administration of each dose of this vaccine needed for both children and adults. The rule also specifies how Medicaid providers can obtain the pandemic influenza vaccine free of charge from the Ohio Department of Health. It is also being modified for five-year rule review, to update date references and to clarify existing policy.

This will increase expenditures.

It is estimated that the cost to cover the pandemic influenza vaccine for the fee for service, medicaid only population will be \$5.1 million annually and \$7.7 million from January 2010 through June 2011. This amount covers the cost of the two doses of the vaccine needed to confer immunity to children under age ten and the cost of one shot for persons aged ten years and over, as well as the billing of a low level evaluation and management code for the non-institutionalized population. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services is providing the vaccine, syringes and needles, and sharps kits free of charge. The increase in expenditures is due to the

administration fee of \$10.00 per shot and for the noninstitutionalized fee for service population, the billing of the lowest level evaluation and management current procedural terminology (CPT) code 99211. The estimates do not take into account the avoided costs of treatment of individuals that would otherwise be infected by the virus and do not include the costs associated with pharmacy-based immunizations which are billed using a NDC code and are discussed in rule 5101:3-9-13.

There is estimated to be no new cost of compliance for this rule. The rule does not require providers to administer the pandemic influenza vaccine, but if a Medicaid provider chooses to offer this service, an administration fee will be paid.
