Providers are required to submit claims in order to receive Medicaid reimbursement. On each claim, a provider reports many pieces of information, such as the identity of the person served, the services provided, related diagnoses, the date of service, and the place of service.

Current rule 5101:3-4-13 has particular reporting requirements: (1) For certain provider-administered pharmaceuticals, specific instructions are given on how to report procedure codes and dosage units on claims. (2) As a condition for reimbursement of certain injections, providers must document specific information in the patient's medical record.

These requirements are being transferred into new rule 5101:3-4-12. New rule 5101:3-4-13 simply cites new rule 5101:3-4-12; it serves to ensure that existing references to rule 5101:3-4-13 remain functional until they can be updated.
