This rule is being proposed for amendment to announce the adoption of 2008 Healthcare Common Procedural Coding System (HCPCS) and 2008 Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) codes effective January 1, 2008 in order to maintain consistency with industry standards, which the department is required to do under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPPA).

This rule outlines coverage provisions for surgical services performed by physicians. The changes incorporate updates to appendix A and appendix B to the surgery rule to add new 2008 Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) surgery codes where pricing deductions for bilateral surgery, multiple surgery, or assistant-at-surgery apply. Codes discontinued by the American Medical Association are listed at the bottom of appendix B for claims with a date of service on or after January 1, 2008.

Every year Healthcare Procedural Coding System (HCPCS) is updated with new and deleted codes. Providers are required to use this coding system when billing for professional services. In order to comply with this rule, providers are required to use the updated billing codes and may incur costs associated with updating the billing software. Due to providers using different software packages to create invoices, we are unable to provide an estimated cost to providers. The cost described is not a new cost and would be required by all payers, not just Medicaid. In addition, Medicaid reimbursement rates were developed to include
