This rule describes the process determining an assistance group and who should be included in the assistance group. OFA proposes to amend this rule. Changes to the rule include:

Paragraph (D)(7) was added outlining that an individual is ineligible to be included in the assistance group who is determined to be convicted under Federal or State law of a drug-related offense which is classified as a felony and has an element of possession, use or distribution of a controlled substance; and

Paragraph (D)(8) was added outlining that an individual is ineligible be included in the assistance group if he/she declare to be convicted of an out of compliance with their sentence for certain crimes occurring on or after February 7, 2014.
