ODMH is reducing the overall required number of hours of continuing education for persons who perform forensic evaluation service, and allowing the CE hours specific to forensic mental health service to be earned over three calander years, rather than per year.

The costs to obtain Continuing Education credit ranges, with some free educational opportunities available. ODMH does not mandate attendance at specific forensic mental health training events, so we are unable to identify the estimated costs. It is anticipated that this rule will reduce costs for some individuals who often attend trainings and conferences lasting more than one day, and earn more than the current minimum of 8 hours/year of CE at one event. Previously CE credit earned could not be carried over into another year, but this rule allows the CE credit to be earned over a 3 year period.
