This rule is being rescinded and its provisions replaced in a new rule, numbered the same as this rule (5160-13-01), as part of the five-year rule review process.

With the exception of the rule on End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) dialysis clinics (5160-13-01.9), the existing rules in Chapter 5160-13 are being rescinded and combined into one new rule (5160-13-01) that addresses all service-based ambulatory health care clinics paid on a fee-for-service basis.

This rule sets forth definitions pertaining to ambulatory health care clinics (AHCCs), eligible AHCC providers, covered services, limitations, and provisions for any organization applying to be a service-based AHCC medicaid provider paid on a fee-for-service basis.

Any organization applying to be a fee-for-service ambulatory health care clinic (AHCC) Medicaid provider must submit to the department upon enrolling the appropriate documentation demonstrating it: (1) meets the definition of an AHCC; (2) is not eligible as a Medicaid provider as a professional association of physicians, dentists, optometrists, opticians, podiatrists, or limited practitioners such as physical therapists, psychologists, or chiropractors; (3) is enrolled as a Medicare provider; (4) bills Medicare as the primary insurer for services provided to patients eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid; and (5) meets all specific requirements of at least one Medicaid AHCC provider type.
