This rule is being proposed for amendment to update policy relating to the administration of the Medicaid managed care program.

This rule describes MCP provider panel and subcontracting requirements. Changes to the rule include: added paragraph (A)(2) to require MCPs to make all provider

subcontracts available to ODM upon request; added paragraph (C)(4), which had been inadvertently removed with the previous rule filing; in paragraphs (D)(8), (D)(33) and (D)(34), added gender identity in the non-discrimination lists; in paragraphs (D)(12) and (D)(13); added language requiring network providers to be enrolled with ODM in compliance with 42 CFR 438.602. Other grammatical/technical edits were made throughout.
