Rule 5160-27-01 entitled "Eligible provider for behavioral health services" sets forth the requirements for behavioral health services provided by community mental health and substance use disorder treatment providers. The proposed revision provides for

a registered nurse to perform a nursing regimen, in accordance with Section 4723.01 of the Ohio Revised Code, without an order from a medical practitioner.

The requirement to acquire a Medicaid provider agreement may result in administrative activities for the provider's staff.

Holding a provider agreement may require the provider to submit updated information to ODM from time to time, such activities would also result in administrative activities for the staff.

Regarding the proposed revisions to the rule, the cost of compliance would be for providers that wish to render and bill Medicaid for nursing services that don't require

an order from a medical practitioner. There may be some providers that would need to update their billing systems in order to submit claims for these services.

Quantifying any cost is difficult because of the significant variance of business design, number of service locations, agency workforce, client caseload, and business acumen among the 820 Medicaid enrolled providers of behavioral health services.
