This rule states the reimbursement policies for behavioral health services rendered by providers certified by the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services. The rule has an appendix which lists covered behavioral health services, billing codes, and reimbursement rates. One revision in the rule body clarifies reimbursement rate

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determination policy. Changes to the appendix include the addition of new services, codes, and reimbursement rates that are aligned with new proposed OhioRISE program rules.

\$317 million

The increased expenditures are a result of added services that are a part of the OhioRISE program being implemented beginning July 1, 2022. The impact of OhioRISE will be \$317 million in FY23. Specialized services for OhioRISE will cost an additional \$265M in SFY 2023. The administrative costs of implementing OhioRISE are \$52 million in SFY 2023.
