This rule is being proposed to update policy relating to the administration of the Medicaid program.

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This rule addresses limitations and coverage policy concerning services rendered by community alcohol and drug treatment providers. The amended rule includes new Medicaid covered services and medications that can be rendered by eligible alcohol and substance abuse treatment providers.

(Week of 11/14 revise file) The only change is in Appendix 2. The word "dispensing" was added to four sentences, the word "week" replaced "visit" in one sentence. All changes were made for clarification. No policy changes were made.

(11/22/2016 refiling) The only change made to this rule package is in Appendix 2. In the last row, code 96372, the text (MD/DO \$21.39)(Non-MD/DO \$18.18)" has been removed and replaced with "\$14.57 (effective through 6/30/2017)." Since the Ohio Department of Medicaid will not require rendering practitioners be listed on Medicaid claims until 7/1/2017, the rate could not be differentiated based on level of practitioner.

While difficult to project due to unknown provider prescribing patterns the cost to ODM of reimbursing for the new services and medications is expected to be no more than \$250,000 for CY 2017. Any cost is a component of the budget associated with the ongoing initiative known as Behavioral Health Redesign, overseen by the Governor's Office of Health Transformation.

Alcohol and substance abuse treatment providers are not required to render any of the newly available medications or services. Providers that wish to provide the medications or services are expected to have the clinical staff needed to do so, therefore, they should not experience any new personnel costs. Any costs are associated with the voluntary provision of the services for which providers will be able to submit claims to Ohio Medicaid for reimbursement.
