The rule requires ODA's designee conduct an in-person assessment to determine eligibility for the assisted living waiver program, to establish a waiver program enrollment date and authorize the provision of waiver services.

The Ohio Department of Medicaid supplies funding to Ohio's 88 counties through the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, Bureau of County Finance and Technical Assistance. This funding is intended to properly supply counties with enough funding to conduct eligibility determinations and casework for the Medicaid Program. State funds are supplied for matching through a mechanism called the Income Maintenance (IM) Allocation. As expenditures are charged, the federal portion of these expenditures is also supplied to the counties. Each county operates daily at different work levels and funds the work done locally differently. Historically, counties have not reported spending in excess of allocation and it is not expected that this change to policy would greatly change that dynamic.

Pursuant to the three-party agreements with ODM and ODA, the PASSPORT Administrative Agencies (PAAs) serve as ODA#s designee. Each PAA varies in business model, size of the organization,infrastructure, and size of caseloads. ODA establishes the site operating budget for each PAA. This funding is intended to properly supply the PAA with enough funding to complete in-person assessments to determine waiver eligibility and provide ongoing case management for individuals enrolled in the waiver. Through the interim payment process outlined in the three-party agreement, ODM requests and deposits the federal share of allocated ODA administrative allowable costs and processes inter agency fund transfers. Historically, the PAAs have not reported spending in excess of the established site operating budgets and it is not expected that this change to policy would greatly change that dynamic.

The Department of Medicaid anticipates that the County Departments of Job and Family Services(CDJFS) will incur training costs. However, each county operates daily at different work levels and funds the work done locally differently. Historically counties have not reported spending in excess of allocation and it is not expected that this change to policy would greatly change that dynamic.

There may be an increase in training costs for the PAAs as a result of the proposed rule. The costs will vary by based on the PAA's infrastructure and size of caseloads. Historically the PAAs have not reported that training costs results in spending in excess of site operating budget and it is not expected that this change to policy would greatly change that dynamic.

(a) Personnel Costs

There may be an increase in personnel costs for the CDJS offices as a result of the proposed rule. However, each county operates daily at different work levels and funds the work done locally differently. Historically counties have not reported spending in excess of allocation and it is not expected that this change to policy would greatly change that dynamic.

There may be an increase in personnel costs for the PAAs as a result of the proposed rule. The personnel costs will vary based on the current staffing patterns, infrastructure and size of caseloads. Historically the PAAs have not reported personnel costs results in spending in excess of site operating budget and it is not expected that this change to policy would greatly change that dynamic.

(b) New Equipment or Other Capital Costs

The Department of Medicaid does not expect any changes in new equipment

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or capital costs for either the CDJFS or the PAAs.

(c) Operating Costs

The CDJFS may incur increased operating costs. However, each county operates daily at different work levels and funds the work done locally differently. Historically counties have not reported spending in excess of allocation and it is not expected that this change to policy would greatly change that dynamic.

There may be an increase in operating costs for the PAAs as a result of the proposed rule. The costs will vary based on the PAAs current business model, the size of the organization, and size of caseloads. Historically the PAAs have not reported spending in excess of site operating budget and it is not expected that this change to policy would greatly change that dynamic.

(d) Any Indirect Central Service Costs

The CDJFS may incur increased indirect central service costs. However, each county operates daily at different work levels and funds the work done locally differently. Historically counties have not reported spending in excess of allocation and it is not expected that this change to policy would greatly change that dynamic.

There may be an increase in indirect central service costs for the PAAs as a result of the proposed rule. The costs will vary based on the the PAAs current business model, the size of the organization, and size of caseloads. Historically the PAAs have not reported spending in excess of site operating budget and it is not expected that this change to policy would greatly change that dynamic.
