The purpose of this rule is to establish the individual options waiver as a component of the Medicaid home and community-based services program pursuant to sections

5166.02 and 5166.20 of the Revised Code. The following changes were made to the proposed rule:

Paragraph (F) was amended to delete adult foster care and adult family living as available services and to add shared living, waiver nursing delegation and participantdirected homemaker/personal care as new services under the waiver.

The Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities estimates that the filing of this rule package will cost an estimated \$17 million to add the new and replacement waiver services. The change to this rule will not have an impact on the budget of the Ohio Department of Medicaid. A waiver amendment was submitted to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) to add Shared Living to the Individual Options waiver as a replacement service for Adult foster care and Adult family living services. Participant-directed Homemaker/personal care is being carved out of Routine Homemaker/personal care and will be funded separately. Waiver nursing delegation will be added as a new service available under the waiver. The proposed effective date of the amendment is January 1, 2018.

The estimated cost of compliance will vary for the County Boards of Developmental Disabilities (CBsDD). Each CBDD is responsible for the non-federal share of the costs of providing services to individuals with developmental disabilities within their county.
