The addition of community transition services to the Ohio Home Care Waiver as a result of the shift of the service from HOME Choice and nursing facility-level of care waiver alignment is projected to result in an increase of \$1,330,000 in expenditures over the SFY 20/21 biennium (\$644,000 in SFY 20 and \$686,000 in SFY 21). The maximum allowable reimbursement for the service is \$2,000 per person.

The reimbursement schedule for the service set forth in this proposed rule is located in proposed OAC rule 5160-46-06. Programmatic costs associated with this policy are reported in this RSFA.
