This rule is being proposed for amendment to update policy related to the administration of the Ohio Home Care Waiver program, and to make permanent during the ongoing COVID-19 public health emergency those emergency rule changes resulting from Executive Order 2020-23D.

7. Summarize the rule's content, and if this is an amended rule, also summarize the rule's changes.

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This rule sets forth the eligibility and enrollment requirements for an individual who participates in the Ohio Home Care Waiver. Paragraph (A)(8) is being amended to reflect that if the individual is unable to provide a signature at the time of enrollment, the individual is to submit an electronic signature or standard signature via regular mail, or otherwise in no instance any later than at the next face-to-face visit with the case manager. Paragraphs (E) and (F) are amended to reflect that once enrolled, the individual will not be disenrolled from the waiver, including when they reach their sixtieth birthday, unless the individual requests disenrollment, moves out of state, transitions between the Ohio home care waiver and the MyCare Ohio waiver, or expires. Miscellaneous citations and dates are updated.
