This rule outlines the definitions and criteria for processing fish and fishery products. The proposed amendment specifically exempts 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations that move fish or fishery products from a food processing establishment to another location under their control and serve the food to the end consumer, without charge.

Pursuant to public comment, we have amended the proposed rule to include senior centers created under section 173.11 of the Revised Code.
