The regulation is a revision of the quarantine aimed at preventing the spread of destructive pest of walnut trees to reflect recent detections in new areas. This revision also clear up some confusing language.

Adding new locations:

To prevent the spread of the destructive pest walnut twig beetle and associated disease known as thousand cankers into the state of Ohio, the states of Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Nevada, North Carolina, New Mexico, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Utah, Virginia and Washington are quarantined.

This is based on the estimated cost of \$1200.00 for fumigation and rental of a container of 40 logs. This is based on figures from Fumigation Services, Inc. and M. Bohlke Veneer Corp.
