All operators must obtain a license prior to operating a concession which cost \$70 annually. All operators must abide by the specific rules of play for each concession type. All operators must have a sign conspicuously posted which complies with the requirements of OCA 901:9-2-05. The cost of the sign will depend on the type of game but will dramatically fluctuate by certain design choices selected by the operator and the vendor they utilize to create the sign. As a minimum, the Department believes that an operator can comply with the regulations for a minimum of \$30. This sign can be utilized for a significant number of years.

901:9-2-10 paragraph A, section 1 removes the requirement that all rings must be are round and unwarped

901:9-2-10 paragraph A, section 1 removes the requirement that the target must be vertically and horizontally level as well as vertically straight.

901:9-2-10 paragraph A, section 1 removes the requirement that a clearance of at least three-eighths of an inch on one side measured from the inside of the ring to the block or target is required.

901:9-2-10 paragraph B, section 1 removes the requirement that the table or stand supporting the bottles shall be of a height so that the top of the bottles to be ringed will not exceed four feet in height from ground level

901:9-2-10 paragraph B, section 1 removes the requirement that if the game is trailer-mounted, the inspector shall determine the height of the base on which the game is set.

901:9-2-10 paragraph B, section 1 removes the requirement that no obstruction shall be placed between, around, or above the bottles at any time.

901:9-2-10 paragraph B, section 1 removes the requirement that the clearance of the ring shall be such that there will be no less than one-fourth inch clearance measured from the inside of the ring to the neck of the bottle.

901:9-2-10 paragraph B, section 1 removes the requirement that ring bottle games shall be

played on level surfaces, and the distance of all obstructions above

901:9-2-10 paragraph B, section 1 removes the requirement that...around all items to be ringed shall not be less than four feet.

901:9-2-10 paragraph C, section 1 removes the requirement that operators of this game shall arrange pins so they remain stationary at all times

901:9-2-10 paragraph C, section 1 removes the requirement that pins shall be so arranged that it is possible to ring each and every pin.

901:9-2-10 paragraph C, section 1 removes the requirement that the top row of pins shall not be higher than four feet above the ground.

901:9-2-10 paragraph C, section 1 removes the requirement that if the game is trailer-mounted, the inspector shall determine the height of the base on which the game is set.

901:9-2-10 paragraph D, section 1 removes the requirement that canes shall be arranged so that each and every cane can be ringed, including all canes with hooked handles

901:9-2-10 paragraph D, section 1 removes the requirement that all canes to be ringed shall have

the end which is to be ringed perpendicular with the ground.

901:9-2-10 paragraph D, section 1 removes the requirement that the clearance of the ring shall be such that there will be no less than three-eighths of an inch clearance measured from the inside of the ring to the head of the cane.

901:9-2-10 paragraph D, section 1 removes the requirement that the measurement shall be made with the ring held next to the head of the cane.

901:9-2-10 paragraph F, section 1 removes the requirement that these games shall have three-eighths of an inch clearance on one side

901:9-2-10 paragraph F, section 1 removes the requirement that blocks shall be flat, solid, uncovered and not more than two inches high.

901:9-2-10 paragraph F, section 1 removes the requirement that no prize shall project over the block.

901:9-2-10 paragraph F, section 1 removes the requirement that each block shall be placed on the table with sufficient clearance to permit any hoop to surround the block unobstructed by merchandise.

901:9-2-10 paragraph F, section 1 removes the requirement that hoops shall be round and uniform in size.

901:9-2-10 paragraph G, section 1 removes the requirement that shall provide targets used that are vertical and are always maintained in a level position;

901:9-2-10 paragraph G, section 1 removes the requirement that all rings shall be round and unwarped and have a three-eighths of an inch clearance on one side.
